

in this quirky oasis Lush planting rules

City gardens are often small. Katherine Roper shows how you can also make them beautiful.

EYOND the patio doors of this basement flat in the heart of Montpellier is a green oasis of calm and tranquillity. This garden demonstrates what can be achieved in a very small space within the

heart of any city. One year on from completing the project, this picture, taken this week, demonstrates how quickly plants can fill out a small garden, creating a lush green backdrop.

Livingoutside

The client did not want a contemporary design and instead requested a quirky, random look rather than a symmetrical or form-

The main feature of note within the existing garden was the beautiful colours in the walls, which were made from local stone in hues of grey and reddy-brown. These colours are picked out in the new patio paving and the stepping stone pathway that leads to it.

In the paying design I incorpor naviors interspersed between traalso locally sourced.

Pea gravel in-fills between the stepping stones, where thyme and other low-growing herbs are starting to spread, soften the hard edges and create a wonderful scent when crushed under foot.

Another important aspect to tackle was the different boundaries to the garden. The original back boundary consisted partly of a neighbouring house, which is painted cream, and partly a wooden fence. In order to lessen the impact of this haphazard edge. I positioned a shed in the back left hand corner, thus breaking up the wall of the house behind.

Painting the shed black dramatically reduces its presence within the space and allows the plants to stand out in front of it, partic ularly the rosemary, in a beautiful ribbed terracotta pot

corner blue and repeated this colour on the trellis forming the left

hand boundary.
This splash of vibrant colour adds excitement to bland boundaries and helps complement the yellow and orange flowers within the planting scheme.

The garden isn't too overlooked considering its urban setting, however a high block of flats beyond dominated the view from within the garden.

In order to lessen the impact of this building, I designed and constructed two chunky solid oak arches, one of which is visible in this picture, the other sits further forward. When the Vitis coigne

tiae and wisteria climbers grow up and cover these arches, they will enhance the feeling of seclusion and privacy within the

In the back right hand corner an evergreen Eriobotrya japonica tree has been planted to close the gap and, in time, it will obscure the flats completely.

The lush foreground planting includes a large tree fern, a Japanese acer, grasses, Sisyrinchium among other specimens, and lastly Crocosmia for vibrant col-
